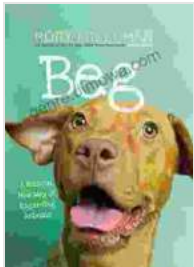

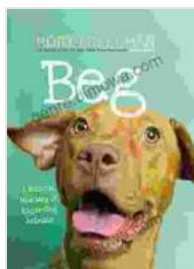
Dale Jamieson is a professor of environmental studies and philosophy at New York University. He is the author of several books on animal ethics,

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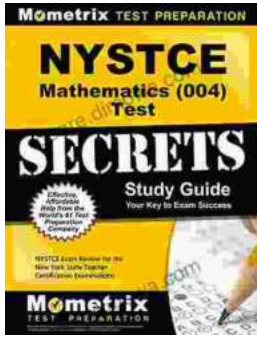
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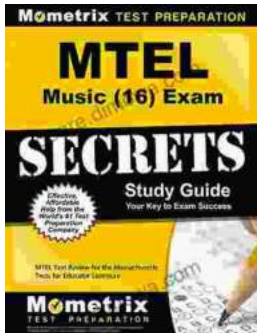
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
