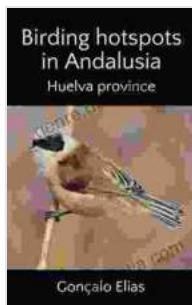


Birding Hotspots in Andalusia's Huelva Province: A Birder's Paradise

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Coastal Wetlands: A Thriving Avian Tapestry

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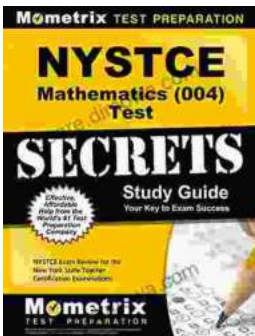
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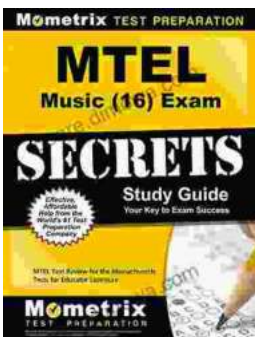


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
